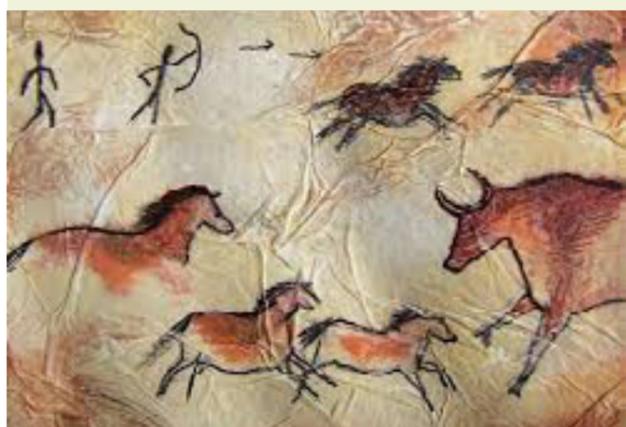

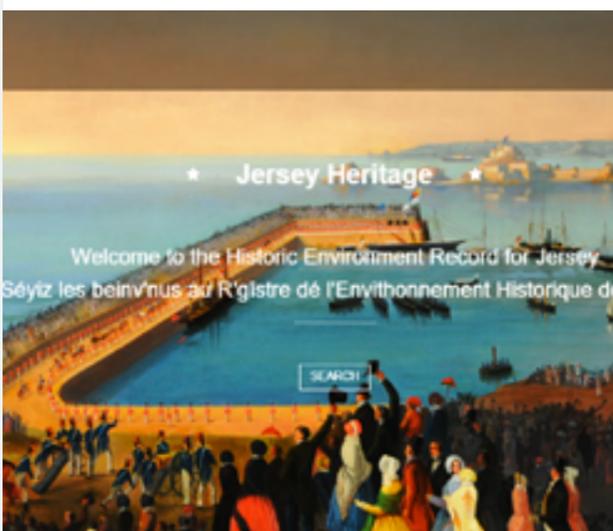

## Les Monts Grantez dolmen

This is a fine passage chamber consisting of a passage of large, upright granite blocks and dry stone walling leading into an oval chamber. Discovered in 1839 it was excavated in 1912 by the Société Jersiaise. The main chamber was found to contain the skeletons of six adults and one child, all lying on their sides in a crouched position. A further skeleton was found in a seated position, propped up by stones in the entrance passage, and the scattered remains of a ninth individual was found in the side chamber. Sinclair will take you back to our Neolithic ancestors and talk about the grave, the skeletons, and the finds that came with them.
